THE MARYLAND CERTIFIED PUBLIC MANAGER® PROGRAM IS:

- academically grounded, built upon a set of core competencies curriculum
- comprised of 300 hours of training, including classes, projects, readings and exams centered on management principles courses
- presented in five retreat weeks, with the alternate month highlighted by a Leadership Luncheon focused on a public service topic:

Retreat 1: Leadership Style and Personal Productivity

Retreat 2: Strategic Management and Lean Management

Retreat 3: Managing Public Resources

Retreat 4: Data-based Decision Making

Retreat 5: External Management: Communication and Legislative Process

The instructional team includes University of Baltimore faculty, public management experts and practitioners.
