

## **Request for Proposal (RFP) – The Energy Corridor Districts Answers to Submitted Questions**

The questions and answers posted below apply to both Requests for Proposals.

- The Energy Corridor District’s Design Standards and Streetscape Guidelines
- The Energy Corridor District’s Strategic Action Plan

### **Q1: Is the ECD interested in bringing in national expertise or local firms to respond to the RFQs?**

A1: The District is interested in hiring the firm(s) with demonstrated qualifications and relevant experiences applicable to achieving the stated scope of work, and who, at a minimum, satisfactorily meets the requirements outlined in the RFQ.

### **Q2: What are explicit goals the District is looking to achieve with the two projects (compared to goals of the 2015 Master Plan)?**

A2: The District’s 2015 Master Plan was an investment to conceptualize long-term planning and opportunities for future growth and development. The master plan is actively used as a long-term planning tool and guide. Each RFQ provides a statement of “Objective” and related “Context” to help frame the purpose of the respective scopes of work. Additionally, the RFQ contains an “About the District” section, which references the District’s revised mission and vision statements, as well as identifies core services and goals. This strategic framework is consistent with the District’s long-term vision to be recognized as a premier place to work, live, play, and invest.

### **Q3: Can a firm submit one qualification package to respond to both RFQs?**

A3: The posted RFQs are to be considered two separate projects. Firms interested in responding to both RFQs should submit a Statement of Qualification package for each respective RFQ.
