Extra Credit: In Romans 9 it speaks about men who have become "vessels of wrath." How does God behave toward them?

1. "civil righteousness, and to work things subject to reason" (Ap XIII, 1).
 2. "work the righteousness of God, that is, spiritual righteousness" (Ap XIII, 1).
 3. Pelagianism: Man's nature is not depraved by the fall.
 4. Pelagianism: Man must make an act of the will in order to be saved.
 5. "Although **the power of concupiscence** is such that men more frequently obey evil dispositions than sound judgment. And the devil, who is efficacious in the godless, as Paul says, Eph. 2, 2, does not cease to incite this feeble nature to various offenses. These are the reasons why **even civil righteousness is rare among men**, as we see that not even the philosophers themselves, who seem to have aspired after this righteousness, attained it" (Ap XVIII, 71-72).
