Extra Credit. What does "Many are called, but few are chosen" mean?

 3. Gospel – Those who believe in Jesus Christ will be saved.
 4. Law – If you continue in your sin, you will not be saved.
 5. Divine Obedience – God desires that His children lead lives of good works.
 6. Gospel – God forgives you because of His Son, Jesus Christ
 7. Law -- If you continue in your sin, you will not be saved.
 8. Eternal Election – Do not fear. The God who elected you from before the creation of the world has promised to bring you to heaven. He has created faith in your heart. And He continues to work through His Word and Sacraments. Continue to confess your sins and believe in Christ. Then be diligent to lead a life of good works out of thankfulness for your salvation.
 9. Law. No one has done enough. We are all sinners. (Then Gospel) Salvation is a free gift for those who give up on doing enough and trust in Jesus for salvation.
 10. Eternal Election – Do not fear. Though the devil is always trying to lead you away from salvation, God is stronger than the devil. Before the creation of the world God determined to save you. He saves His elect by calling you by the Gospel, enlightening you with His gifts, gathering you in His Church, sanctifying you through that same Word and Sacrament.
- Extra Credit. God desires that the many (all people) would be saved, nevertheless, in the end only a relatively small number (the elect or chosen) will be saved. The rest stubbornly reject God's efforts to save them.
