

# Bicycle-themed film night at Coed y Brenin

A BIKE themed evening of film will be held at Coed y Brenin next weekend

The event, which takes place on 23 February at 7pm, will include some short and quirky bicycle films plus two original mountain biking films introduced by the film maker, 15-year-old Will Sanders from Machynlleth.

The feature presentation is Line of Sight by American film maker and adventurer Lucas Brunelle, whose films have appeared in the Bicycle Film Festival and the International Cycling Film Festival.

The film is an inside story of underground bicycle racing around the world.

Through the lens of his helmet camera, viewers are transported into the wild and dangerous world of Alleycat racing, where high speeds, traffic, and pedestrians combine with riders hell-bent on victory at any cost.

The evening of film is be-

ing held in association with Cytser - The Constellation Project.

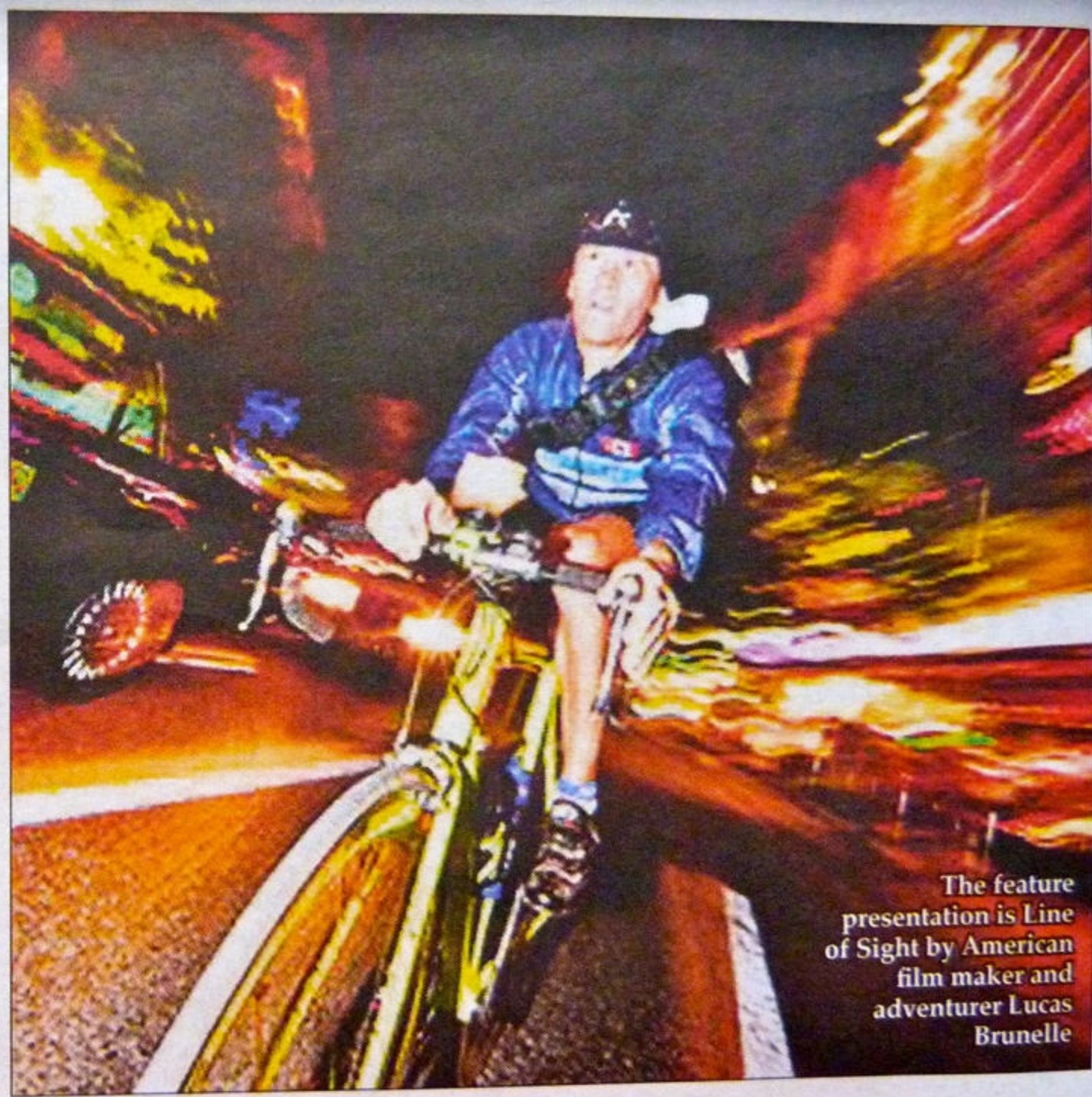
