- Picnic Table & Trash Container

Use shall be Restricted to the following:

- Wildlife Preserve
- Nature Area
- Passive Recreation

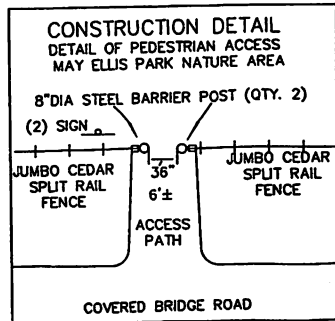
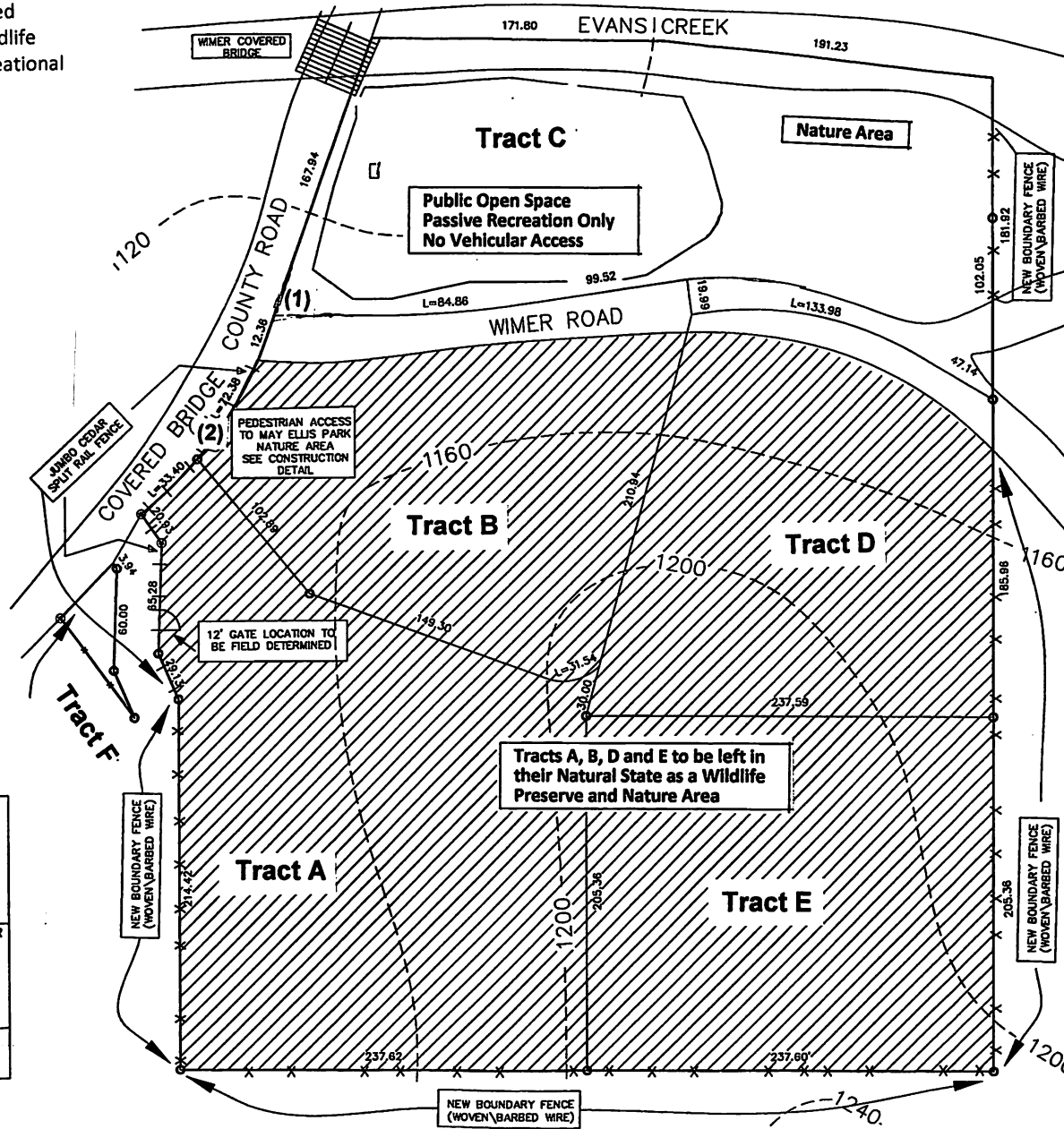
Optional Improvements:
