# Overview

---

## Program Description

The Denali Commission (Commission) will implement the *Tribal Victim Services Set-Aside Micro-Grant Program* (Micro-Grant Program) in partnership with the U.S. Department of Justice (DOJ), Office of Justice Programs (OJP), Office for Victims of Crime (OVC).

The Commission will release a Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) for the Micro-Grant Program in July with expected applications due in September 2020 (Round 1). Training and technical assistance will be available to interested communities. If all funds are not expended, a second round of funding will be released in March of 2021 (Round 2).

These micro-grants will be available for use by eligible Alaska Tribes and Tribal Consortia for a wide range of programs, activities, and services to crime victims. These services are expected to include, but not limited to:

- Assessing the victim assistance needs of the Tribal community;
- Developing a strategic plan to create a victim assistance program;
- Developing a victim assistance program; expanding services provided to Alaska Native and/or American Indian victims (such as crisis intervention, mental health services, forensic interviewing of children, victim court advocacy, legal support, financial services, health services, court and victim advocacy, law enforcement-or prosecutive-based victim services, bilingual/multilingual services, health/cultural practice, etc.);
- Expanding populations served (such as children, older victims, individual with disabilities, male victims of sexual assault and/or domestic violence; adults who were victimized as children/adolescents, etc.); and/or
- Expanding types of crime addressed (such as human trafficking, financial crimes, child physical and sexual abuse, sexual assault, homicide, cybercrimes, opioid/drug-related criminal victimization, etc.).

## Notice of Intent to Apply Process

Alaska Tribal communities and/or organizations interested in applying **and eligible** for Round 1 Funding may submit *Micro-Grant Program – Victims of Crime -Notice of Intent to Apply* form in this NOIA. By submitting this NOIA application, this signals an interest in applying for the full Micro-Grant NOFO and an interest in receiving training and technical assistance prior to the full application process. It does not commit the applicant to applying for the Micro-Grant Program. Potential Micro-Grant applicants are **not required** to respond to this NOIA. The information presented in this form will be shared with the Alaska Training and Technical Assistance provider.

## Additional Information

**Funding** The micro-grants may not exceed \$350,000.

**Performance Period** Year 1: October 1, 2020 – September 30, 2021  
Year 2: October 1, 2021 – September 30, 2022

**Eligible Organizations** Eligible applicants include Alaska Tribes, Tribal Consortia, and Tribal non-profits.

**Round 1 Exclusions** Tribal communities listed in Appendix A are ineligible for the first round of applications. These communities already received funds from DOJ OVC in Federal Fiscal Year 2018 and/or 2019. If all funds are not distributed in Round 1, these communities are eligible to apply in Round 2. This NOIA applies only to Round 1.

**Additional Notes** Potential Micro-Grant Applicants may apply without responding to this NOIA.
