Arnold Preservation Council (APC) has just received a copy of the completed study of the intersection of Route 2 and East Joyce Lane. When APC inquired last May, APC was told that there were no plans to do anything to Route 2, the most significant road in Arnold and on the Broadneck Peninsula. Yet, this study and another one announced by Secretary Rahn specifically address Route 2.

APC had no knowledge that this Route 2/ East Joyce Lane study was being done. As one of the guiding organizations in Arnold, APC has been very involved in monitoring the multiple developments along East Joyce Lane and are repeatedly being asked by constituents, “With all these new houses and increased traffic, what is being done about the Route 2 intersection at East Joyce Lane?”

APC would like to be informed about and included in SHA’s processes that directly affect APC and its constituents. APC officially requests to be added to any relevant distribution lists (president@arnoldpreservationcouncil.org). Specifically, APC would like to know what the next steps are that SHA will be taking on the completed study. Will there be an opportunity for APC/public input? Are public hearings planned? How can Arnold constituents contribute?
