PRESCHOOL REPORT

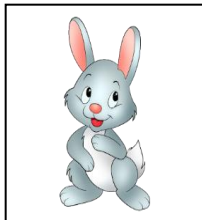

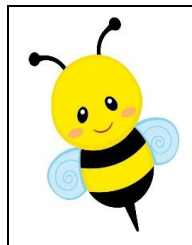

◆ Bumble Bee Class

Dear Parents,

Greetings! We are doing well in this fall season. It's hard to believe we are entering November already! Where, oh where, did the time go? Let's review last month's highlights.

Our selected themes for the past month were Fall and Fall Review, Nocturnal Animals, Fire Safety, Pumpkins and Halloween. We focused on the letters D, E and F as our letters of the week. We began with week one as an observation of the Fall season. Our Weekly Reader, called "Sing a Song of Autumn," led us into a great introduction of all things fall. The children were quite familiar with most of the colors, things and animals found in nature during this time of the year. The children also completed a Fall booklet that included the many multi-colored things of Autumn. The children colored and completed activity sheets: Letter Dd and Trace Dd, and used Do a Dot markers to trace and write Dd. Picture Day went very well. I am sure you were pleased with the results. Next, we had another week of Fall activities. We began the week with activity sheet Christopher Columbus "Santa Maria" and reviewed fun facts about this explorer. We then

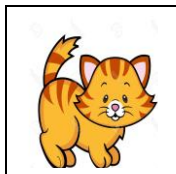


moved on to how animals prepare for winter. Our selected animals to review were squirrels, raccoons and owls. The activity sheets that the Bumble Bees completed were "Getting Ready Squirrel," "Midnight Snack Raccoon," and "Wise Owl Gives a Hoot." We also talked and read books about scarecrows and how they are placed in fields to scare away crows. The children completed two color sheets about scarecrows. For the Letter Ee, we completed activity sheets, "Ernie Easter Egg," "Elephant," "Trace Ee," "Letters and Sounds Ee" and "Elephant's Peanuts." The following week, our class focused on Fire Safety. Our Weekly Reader, "Do You Hear the Fire Truck?" helped us to discover how firefighters protect us and keep themselves safe during a fire. We read several books about fire safety and even went on a scavenger hunt to locate all fire exits, fire extinguishers and smoke detectors in the building. We even stepped outside one morning to see the fire hydrant. The Bumble Bees were very quiet and well behaved as we tip-toed through the building on our hunt. Well done!! The assignments for fire safety week were "Fire Truck," "Letters and sounds Ff," "Fire Truck Map," "Trace F," "Fire Fighter," "Fish Ff," "Fire fighter frying fish on an open fire," and "Fire fighter gear." Our art activity for the week was our Dalmation, the Fire Dog. Finally, the class participated in pumpkins and Halloween week. The list of exciting activities for this week were: Weekly Reader: Parts of a Pumpkin, The Story of a Pumpkin Seed, Scooping seeds, Alike Pumpkins, Bat headband and Trick or Treat safety tips. We read many books on pumpkins and Halloween. Of course, the highlight of the month was our Halloween Party. Thank you so much, Parents, for helping to make our party a success. Congratulations to Charlie and Oakley for receiving the class pets, the Zips, to take home for the weekend to reward good behavior. Well done! Keep up the good work, Bumble Bees! 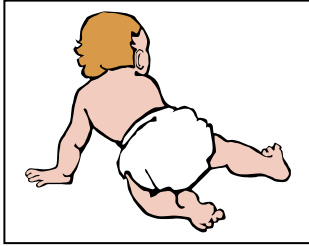

Dear Parents,
I hope everyone had a wonderful Halloween and is ready for the excitement of the next few months. After the craziness of



2020, everyone is entitled to a wonderful holiday season! I missed the excitement of the annual trip to the Pumpkin Patch. I hope you were able to enjoy that tradition with your family since we were not able to go this year. We finished our Community helpers discussions and reviewed number writing. We matched community helpers to their vehicles and made a book that helps with forming the numerals, 0 to 9. Next, we studied the changes that our new season will bring. We distinguished between things that happen in the fall and other seasons and practiced reading color words to color fall leaves. We made a tearing paper fall tree, showing the colors of fall. We harvested nuts with the squirrels, by graphing the types of nuts they collected and counting backwards from 10 to 1. The next week we learned who Christopher Columbus was and why he is important to our country's history. We traced his journey on the globe, learned the names of his three ships, and learned who he met when he arrived in the new world. We made a book reviewing the facts we had learned. The rest of this week, we talked about fire safety. We did a Let's Find Out about fire safety, practiced Stop, Drop and Roll and crawled under the smoke. We completed several worksheets about ways to stay safe from fire and completed a book reviewing everything we had discussed. We even watched some videos that helped us understand fire safety. The next week we moved on to nocturnal animals and pumpkins. We learned facts about nocturnal animals and read books explaining these facts. We made an owl and traced a bat stencil. We did a Let's Find Out about pumpkin parts and practiced sorting pumpkins by size. We made a book illustrating the life cycle of a pumpkin and practiced matching upper and lower case letters. The last week of the month, we celebrated Halloween. We named a lot of things we think about at Halloween and decided whether each one is real or not. We made a flip book showing a lot of costume choices. We also made a Jack-o-lantern and a spider, investigated the insides of a real pumpkin, traced ghost stencils, and practiced ordering letters, color words, patterning and counting sets. Our party was a huge success!! Thank you to everyone who helped out! Letter printing continues to improve each week. I have introduced all of the color words now, and many of the children already know them all. Everyone has made great progress in the two months we have had together. Kori blows kisses when leaving. She likes playing in the gym.

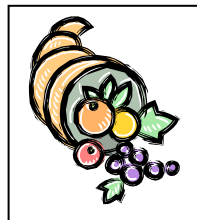
Lucas turned one! He likes watching everything going on in the classroom.
