**RESOLUTION NO. 2019-115**

**A RESOLUTION URGING THE NEW JERSEY BOARD OF PUBLIC UTILITIES TO REQUIRE LANDLINE AND WIRELESS TELEPHONE SERVICE UTILITIES TO IMPLEMENT THE NECESSARY TECHNOLOGY TO BLOCK ROBOCALLS TO THEIR CUSTOMERS, FREE OF CHARGE, AND TO ENACT REGULATIONS TO PREVENT ROBOCALLS FROM REACHING CUSTOMERS**

**WHEREAS**, a “robocall” is a telephone call often placed by telemarketers who use a computerized auto dialer to deliver a pre-recorded message; and

**WHEREAS** “Telephone scammers” are individuals or groups that make unsolicited phone calls to individuals with the purpose of stealing money or personal information. Scams may come through phone calls from real people, robocalls, or text messages. The Scammers often make false promises, such as opportunities to buy products, invest money, or receive free product trials. Scammers may also offer money through free grants and lotteries. Some scammers call pretending to be from government agencies, such as the IRS with threats of jail or lawsuits if they are not paid; and

**WHEREAS**, “Neighbor spoofing”, otherwise known as “NPA-NXX spoofing”, is a form of caller ID fraud used by telemarketers, scammers, and robocallers. “Neighbor spoofing” uses auto-dialing and VoIP (Voice over Internet Protocol) services to send unsolicited phone calls. These calls have an outgoing Caller ID that closely matches your area code and phone number. By mimicking their caller ID as closely as possible to the phone number they are placing the call to, spammers can trick more of their targets into answering the phone. This strategy ultimately increases the odds spammers will successfully get victims to give up personal information scammers can use to steal; and

**WHEREAS**, under federal law, written consent is required for all robocalls or texts made to a wireless telephone number; further, telemarketers have never been permitted to make robocalls to a wireless telephone number based solely on an "established business relationship" with the customer; and

**WHEREAS**, robocalls and Scammer calls have increased in recent years because new technology has made it cheaper and easier for telemarketers and Scammers to make calls from anywhere in the world while hiding their identities by displaying fake caller identification information by using, among other devious tactics, “Neighbor spoofing”; and

**WHEREAS**, most telephone users consider robocalls and scammer calls to be a nuisance and disruptive and are frustrated with their inability to stop scam or robocalls; and

**WHEREAS**, scammer calls in particular place unknowing individuals of our community in peril of economic and emotional hardship; and

**WHEREAS**, while New Jersey and other states have enacted laws to curtail unwanted scammer and telemarketing calls including robocalls, enforcing these laws has proven difficult as many of the unwanted telemarketing and scammer calls originate out-of-state or from foreign countries; and

**WHEREAS**, there is technology available that could block scammer and robocalls from reaching customers; and

**WHEREAS**, landline and wireless telephone service providers are, for the most part, Public Utilities and within the governing purview of the New Jersey Board of Public Utilities; and

**WHEREAS**, landline and wireless telephone service providers can implement the necessary technology that would block robocalls from reaching customers; and

**WHEREAS**, the New Jersey Board of Public Utilities should enact the necessary regulations to require landline and wireless telephone service providers to block robocalls from reaching their customers.

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Carlstadt that the New Jersey Board of Public Utilities is to respectfully urge landline and wireless telephone service providers to implement the necessary technology to block scam and robocalls to their customers, free of charge, and to enact regulations to prevent scam and robocalls from reaching customers; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** copies of this resolution, shall be sent to the New Jersey Board of Public Utilities and to Carlstadt's Representatives in the New Jersey State Senate and House.

**UNFINISHED BUSINESS:**

Mayor Lahullier entertained a motion to open the hearing of citizens. On motion by Roseman, seconded by Bartlett, unanimous on call of roll of those present.

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**HEARING OF CITIZENS:**

**Donald Molzon, 530 Madison Street** – he asked the Mayor and Council for the status of the Senior Housing project. Mayor Lahullier said he met with Bergen County officials and the hundred percent funding looks very promising and hopefully they will hear from the County before the end of the year. Also he asked about the property on Garden Street. The Mayor said the Borough is waiting for the Bond to clear and hopefully the contract to build the soccer complex will be signed in June of this year. Councilmen Emerson and Roseman added that the field will be a multi-purpose recreation. Mr. Molzon asked why the Mayor and Council don't impose recreation fees to help alleviate the expenses. Councilman Emerson responded by doing that we will reduce the amount of sign-ups every year and as of right now the amount of children is not too high. Mr. Gunter Kuprat added if the town charges a minimum fee of \$10.00 parents will be more responsible in signing them up and keeping them in the program. A long discussion took place among the Councilmen.

**Susanna Stroud, 541 First Street** – she mentioned to the Mayor and Council that there's no need for another field especially in that intersection where already the traffic is horrendous. She said the concerns now is having children crossing the street to go to the adjacent stores. Also she mentioned that on the five hundred block of First Street a couple of houses are becoming multi-dwellings. She is concerned because the parking is so limited and she would like the Mayor and Council to look into it. Councilman Roseman said to Mrs. Stroud the Zoning Official looked into the situation a year ago and his determination was a one family owned.

**Abishake Shah, 311 Lilac Lane** – he asked the Mayor and Council about the Bond Ordinance for the proposed soccer field if it is paying for the whole project or just the field. Mayor Lahullier said the Bond is for the whole project. He asked the Mayor and Council why the Bond Ordinance was approved so quickly knowing that there is a need of space for the school. Councilman Roseman explained to Mr. Shah that it is the responsibility of the Carlstadt Board of Education not the Governing Body. A long discussion took place on school properties.

Mayor Lahullier entertained a motion to close the hearing of citizens. On motion by Bartlett, seconded by Zimmermann, unanimous on call of roll of those present.

## BOROUGH OF CARLSTADT

**Whereas**, it is with a sense of local pride and appreciation to extend warmest regards to the family members and friends of **John “Red” Palsi Jr.** as you gather in the Borough of Carlstadt to recognize and honor him for a lifetime of dedicated service; and

**Whereas**, **John “Red” Palsi Jr.**, was born on April 28, 1933 and resided in South Bergen until his passing on March 30, 2018 at the age of 84. He was known as individual who has been recognized as having exhibited the attributes of a citizen known and remembered for his service to family, community and country; and

**Whereas**, after attending East Rutherford High School, **John “Red” Palsi Jr.** served aboard the USS Abbot, a U.S. Navy destroyer, for four years during the Korean War, then returned to establish the Halfway Bar & Grill at the corner of Paterson Plank Road and Washington Avenue from 1958 to 2002, which is now known as Redd’s Restaurant and Bar from 2002-2018; and

**Whereas**, as a husband, father, and hard-working restaurateur in the community, **John “Red” Palsi Jr.** has lived a full life devoted to his wife Elsie Ann “Tootsie” (Urciuli) Palsi, his children John, Darlene, Daniel, David, and Douglas, and as a steadfast business man in the Borough of Carlstadt for 60 years, leaving a legacy worthy of recognition and honor; and
