



ROHS Compliance Declaration

The Restriction of Hazardous Substances Directive 2002/95/EC (RoHS 1) is a law that restricts the use of certain hazardous substances in electrical and electronic equipment. RoHS 1 was adopted in February 2003 by the European Union. The RoHS 2 directive (2011/65/EU) is an evolution of the original directive with the addition of certain phthalates to the restricted substances list which became law on 21 July 2011 and took effect 02 January 2013. The RoHS 3 directive (2015/863), a further evolution with additional restricted phthalates became effective on 22 July 2019. The current RoHS 3 directive restricts the use of the following substances in electronic components:

- **Cadmium (Cd):** < 100 ppm
- **Lead (Pb):** < 1000 ppm
- **Mercury (Hg):** < 1000 ppm
- **Hexavalent Chromium: (Cr VI)** < 1000 ppm
- **Polybrominated Biphenyls (PBB):** < 1000 ppm
- **Polybrominated Diphenyl Ethers (PBDE):** < 1000 ppm
- **Bis(2-Ethylhexyl) phthalate (DEHP):** < 1000 ppm
- **Benzyl butyl phthalate (BBP):** < 1000 ppm
- **Dibutyl phthalate (DBP):** < 1000 ppm
- **Diisobutyl phthalate (DIBP):** < 1000 ppm

ProMed's Position on RoHS:

ProMed does not have or manufacture its own products. **ProMed** does not intentionally include ROHS restricted substances in our manufacturing processes. **ProMed** manufactures molded silicone components, many with metallic inserts and wire leads, per designs provided by its customers on contract basis. It is **ProMed's** position that its customers define and own their product design, Bill of Material (BOM), and it's associated Approved Manufacturer's List (AML) and to that



end, ProMed feels its customers have total ownership and responsibility for identifying and specifying the components on their BOM to meet compliance requirements by European Union or other regulatory agencies.

It is ProMed's policy to build customer products in full compliance with customer's design and Bill of Material. ProMed does not and will not deviate from Customer's Bill of Material unless it has full approval and consent from its customers.
