Fall book sale: November 6-7



The Fall Used Book Sale will be Friday, November 6 from 3:00 to 6:00 p.m. and Saturday, November 7 from 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. in the Community Room at the library. This sale will feature a huge selection of media items — music CDs, DVDs, and even VHS tapes for those who still have a VHS player around the house. There will be a bigger-than-usual section of non-fiction books including cookbooks, holiday books for adults and children, and even puzzles and games. Most book prices are in the 50 cent to \$1 range, except for some especially nice books in the "Quality Books at Great Prices" section with prices as marked, most from \$2-\$5.

There is always a line when the sale opens on Friday, so arrive early for the best selection. If you like a bargain though, all regularly priced books will be \$2 for a bag (bag is provided) during the last hour of the sale on Saturday from 3-4:00. Media and special priced books will be 50% off during this last hour of the sale.

Just a reminder that credit cards are now being accepted for payment, as well as cash and checks, so there is no reason you can't pick up books for gifts or to add to your own collection.

Washington County Library Levy



A levy which will replace the existing library levy, Measure 34-235, is on Washington County ballots on November 3. This levy replacement will provide 40% of Washington County's contribution to each of the WCCLS libraries' funding and is crucial for maintaining our current high quality services. The rate is 5 cents higher than the last levy - the first increase since 2006. We need it to pass, and your vote is very important.

Oregon Battle of the Books



The Friends contributed \$2000 to fund the Tualatin Library's Oregon Battle of the Books program. OBOB is a statewide voluntary reading motivation and comprehension initiative for students in 3rd-12th grades. Our contribution will pay for books for fifteen 3rd-5th grade students. Each student will receive two books per month from September through February.

With OBOB, students are exposed to quality literature representing a variety of literary styles and viewpoints. The mission is to encourage and recognize students who enjoy reading, broaden reading interests, increase reading comprehension, promote academic excellence, and encourage cooperative learning and teamwork among students.

Dia de los Muertos



Día de los Muertos is a festive occasion set aside to honor, remember, and celebrate the lives of departed loved ones. The library held a family event on October 31st to celebrate Dia de los Muertos with crafts, games, and food. The Friends supported this program with a \$400 donation.

Movie license



At our September meeting, the Friends voted to fund the library's annual \$1000 movie license expense. This allows the library to show movies in the library throughout the year in compliance with copyright laws.
