At Get In The Car (GITC), “[o]ur group endeavors to provide a safe meeting place for all attendees and encourages each person here to contribute to fostering a secure and welcoming environment in which our meeting can take place.”

In response to the ongoing situation caused by COVID-19, GITC has several safety procedures in place. These procedures are outlined below and are subject to change:

- GITC is following suggestions set forth by the Center of Disease Control (CDC). Attending meetings in-person at Center of Unity will require you to provide your first name, last initial and phone number to an assigned GITC Group Member before entering the building. This information will be added to a list and kept by GITC for 30 days. The list will allow us to contact you in the case of potential exposure to COVID-19. In the event you or someone with whom you have close contact becomes ill with COVID-19, it is your responsibility to notify GITC immediately (<http://www.getinthecar.org/contact/>). By providing your contact information and entering Center of Unity, you agree to these terms.
- If an attendee is not comfortable providing their first name, last initial and phone number, there will be a laptop available for use on the patio that will be connected to GITC’s Zoom Meeting and managed by a GITC Group Member.

GITC will be conducting cleanings before and after each meeting to all areas of the church accessible by attendees. Attendees will not be required to wear masks; however, we will have them available if you would feel more comfortable wearing one. We will also continue to practice safe social distancing measures by maintaining chair spacing of 6’ between attendees and limiting the number of people allowed into the church at one time.

If you’re sick, stay home. Know the symptoms of COVID-19. These symptoms may appear between 2 to 14 days after exposure.

- Fever, cough, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- Chills or repeated shaking with chills
- Muscle pain, headache, sore throat
- New loss of taste or smell
