















CCSD POLICE

The Cobb County School District Police Department features a total of 68 highly trained officers.

The average Cobb County School District Police Officer has more than 24 years of service under their belt. This means the Cobb County School District Police Department has more than 1,700 years of combined service experience! These officers are highly trained, come with serious experience, and many years of proven, faithful service.

CODE RED

Unannounced Code Red Drills (UCRD) allow for a "snapshot" of a school's preparedness for a Code Red Lockdown, with a follow-up debriefing and discussion for administrators.

SECURITY CHECKS

School internal security checks provide random evaluation of a school's internal security awareness and actions by staff and students to identify suspicious persons in school without proper identification or purpose.

The CCSD Police have procedures in place to follow-up on violent threats or crimes received after normal school hours involving school students/staff or facilities.

CCSD PD-WORKING TOGETHER

CCSD PD has contacts with the US Attorney's Office (Northern District of GA), FBI (Joint Terrorism Task Force [JTTF], Counter Terrorism Working Group [CTWG], & Interagency Intelligence Working Group [IIWG]), Georgia Bureau of Investigation/Georgia Information Sharing & Analysis Center [GISAC], and Georgia & Cobb Emergency Management Agency/Homeland Security, and Cobb County/local Police Departments.

EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT SPECIALIST

One Emergency Management Specialist position was created in April 2018 to dedicate efforts at enhancing the District's emergency response planning and procedures. Two officers with over 20(+) years of collective emergency response planning experience have established a goal of developing a comprehensive emergency response plan for each District school/facility.

ALERTPOINT

AlertPoint is an emergency notification system to augment existing emergency response procedures. It allows for a simultaneous emergency notification throughout the entire campus within seconds and identifies where the incident activity originated.

DISTRICT FACTS

AROUND THE DISTRICT

The Cobb County School District maintains approximately 3,300 cameras throughout the district, giving safety officials and school leaders a thorough and almost constant view of every corner of our school district.

Attendance related incidents have steadily declined over the last three years.

We have also seen a reduction in the number of detentions received by students over the past three school years (2017 to 2019). Detentions have shown a 28% decline while also seeing a decline in the number of days students missed instructional time due to discipline issues.







EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT PROCEDURES

Copies of the Emergency Management Procedures Flip Chart were provided for each school's leadership and posted on the PD Intranet page for additional access/downloading. The Flip Chart is updated regularly.

The Emergency Quick Reference Guide (EQRG) is a one-page document providing an overview of the CCSD emergency codes and other valuable emergency procedures.

Lockdown and lockout drills provide students and staff instruction and periodic refresher training of procedures to improve proficiency and effectiveness.



ACTIVE SHOOTER TRAINING

An award-winning video has been created for staff training and additional videos for elementary and middle/high school students have been completed and were released for viewing in April 2019.



All CCSD schools have received training to respond to incidents involving severe bleeding. Staff members are taught how to apply and use a tourniquet to effectively respond to arterial bleeding or other severe bleeding caused by trauma.



SAFESCHOOLS - ALERT TIP LINE

The CCSD has partnered with SafeSchools Alert to create a formal Tip Line which was fully implemented in April 2019, which can be used by students, staff and parents anonymously.



CCSD PD is working with the Cobb County Police Department anti-gang task force to raise awareness of gang activity and minimize potential gang activity in our schools.



CONCERNED COPS

"Concerned Cops" is a mentoring program for high school and middle school students for effectively relating to authority figures (i.e. school teachers, administrators, police, etc.). Students are taught coping skills, learning through role playing and discussion, to follow directions, and constructively deal with perceptions of biased or disrespectful behavior.

The Cobb County School District Police Department has 68 patrol vehicles at the ready, dramatically improving response time to calls, no matter where they occur within the district.

The Cobb County School District Police Department also features 11 officers with tactical training and experience to serve in the most stress-filled situations.
