U.S. Flag Dates to Remember

It's appropriate to display the flag everyday (as long as it flies in accordance with the rules of the U.S. Flag Code). The flag should be displayed, from sunrise to sunset, on all days when the wealther permits. However, it's particularly important to fly the flag on the following days:
