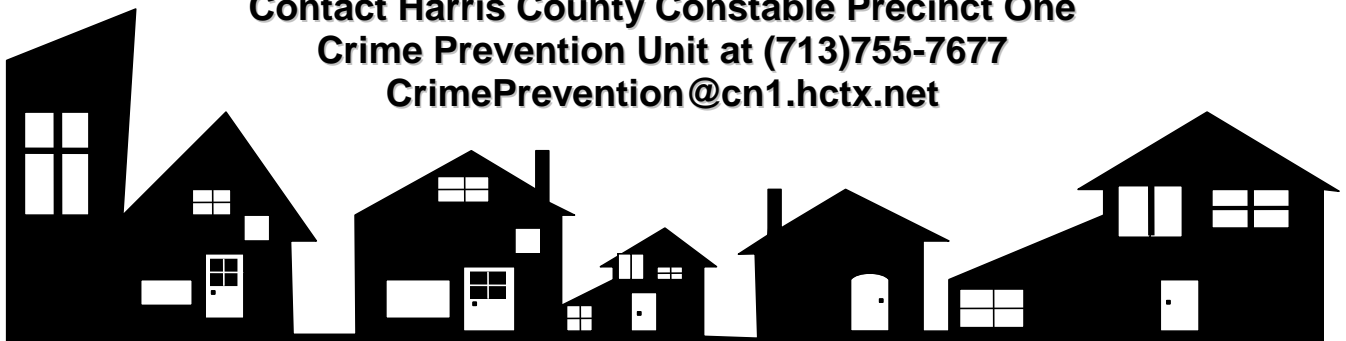


# **Alan Rosen, Constable Harris County Precinct One Home Security Inspection Checklist**

While it is strongly recommended that you make every attempt to secure your home as adequately as possible by complying with all areas of this survey, not all items are required in order to qualify for a possible home owners insurance discount. Those items denoted by “\*\*\*” indicate an area of security that your home **MUST** be in compliance with to meet the Texas Department of Insurance qualifications for a reduction in home owners insurance. (Please check with your local insurance agent to see if your agency honors this deduction.)

If your home meets the requirements listed, a Deputy will provide your insurance company with the proper documentation needed for your discount.
