2020-2021 School Profile

School Facts

The Medina County Career Center is comprised of 11th and 12th graders from six associate school districts. Black River, Brunswick, Buckeye, Cloverleaf, Highland and Medina students are able to choose from twenty-six career-technical programs they would like to pursue. Students are able to take college preparatory, advanced placement and college credit plus courses which are NCAA approved, while learning about a career major during their school day. The current enrollment for the 2020-2021 school year is 990 students. In the 2018-2019 school year, we had 141 students advance to State Career-Technical Program competitions. Out of those students, twenty-two reached National Competition where one student earned a National Gold Medal for SkillsUSA, the Culinary Team was recognized as second best in the country and five students placed in the top ten at the International Conference for Health Occupations. The 2019-2020 competitions were cancelled.

Class Schedule

Students have four academic periods per day with each lasting 45 minutes and their career-technical program is approximately three periods per day totaling 155 minutes daily.

School Information/Identity

While the Medina County Career Center operates as an independent school district within Medina County, the students who attend our school are still considered students of their home associate high schools. The grades/credits students earn in their classes at the Medina County Career Center are reported on their home associate schools' transcripts and students adhere to their home associate schools' graduation requirements. Students' cumulative GPAs are generated following their home associate schools' criteria, which includes weighting any appropriate courses. Medina County Career Center students earn Career Passports after successfully completing their Career Tech programs. However, they receive their diplomas from their home associate schools. Therefore, the following academic/grade information originates with the home associate school and can be found in their profiles and/or transcripts:
