DISCLAIMER

Cremation of Remains

- Cremation of the donor's remains shall be done at an independent crematory facility. DonorCure is not liable for any claims arising from the performance of such as long as it does not contravene government regulations and the disclosures consented to by the donor or their legal representative.
- Non-organic matters attached to the body such as dental fillings, bridgework, gold inlays, prostheses, and pieces of jewelry may be discarded without prior notification to the family.
- Due to the nature of body donation, DonorCure does not guarantee that all parts of the donor's body will be included in the cremation. We do send a written notification to families informing them whether all of the donor's cremated remains will be sent back or just parts of it.
- Should the family opt for the cremated remains to be scattered at sea, DonorCure reserves the right to choose the time and venue of the ceremony.

Cost and Expenses Coverage

- DonorCure guarantees to cover all expenses related to body donation once a donor is accepted. Even if the donor is accepted during pre-screening, their medical condition and medical research needs at the time of passing will ultimately determine their eligibility. Their donation can still be declined if deemed unfit. In these instances, DonorCure's cost coverage guarantee is not valid.
- If a donor is accepted but subsequently denied, all related costs and expenses up until the point of denial will be assumed by DonorCure. Funeral and burial expenses after this time will be on the family's account.
- If the family contacts a funeral home by themselves to transport the body and DonorCure fails to come up with a pricing arrangement with them, we will only cover a reasonable amount of the transportation cost. The remainder shall be paid for by the family in order to proceed with the donation process.
- If the individual making the donation later rescind it or if a family member disputes of the donation, all costs incurred in relation to the donation will be on the account of that individual or disputing family member.
