I know that is a mouthful, but there are things we can be doing such as Americanism by recognizing high school ROTC outstanding Cadets, or caring for our comrades by supporting the Boulder City Veterans Home and much more.

JWV POST DUTIES, SUBMITTED BY MORT FRIEDLANDER

The JWV Constitution and By-Laws draws a picture to help us guide Post 64. Here is what it tells us about each position in the Post. I assume at this time that the Commander and Vice-Commanders have become thoroughly familiar with their duties. Thus, we will begin with a number of other positions. Like who knew we were supposed to do these things?

JUDGE ADVOCATE (Mort Friedlander): The Judge Advocate shall advise the Officers and Executive Committee on all legal matter including the construction and interpretation of the Constitution and By-Laws and shall perform such other duties as are usually incident to the office.

He shall familiarize himself with Legislative matters and be able to interpret to the Post the legal implications involved, and action to be taken.

Whenever possible this office should be held by an Attorney-at-Law.

He shall maintain a file of all legislation, local state and national, for quick and ready reference. This file shall be turned over to his successor at the conclusion of his term of office.

THE ADJUTANT (Bea Siefman):

- 1. Shall keep correct records of the proceedings of the meetings after they have been corrected and approved.**
- 2. Under the direction of the Commander, conduct correspondence and issue all necessary orders and meeting notices.**
- 3. Prepare such books and blanks as are required for the use of the organization.**
- 4. Keep proper files of all correspondence and copies of all general and special releases numbered in the sequence in which they are issued.**
- 5. Keep a roster of the Post, consisting of the names and addresses of all current officers, all Past Commanders and all other members.**
- 6. Keep a list of applicants rejected by the Post, making immediate report of such rejections in all cases through channels to Department Headquarters and National Headquarters.**
- 7. Keep a copy of the original application of every member admitted to the Post.**
- 8. Keep a roll of departed comrades.**
- 9. Keep a register of all visitors to the Post meetings.**
- 10. Promptly transfer to his/her successor all books, papers, and property of the Post which may be in his possession and perform such other duties as are usually required by this office.**

CHAPLAIN (Lori Bordman): The Post Chaplain shall be the spiritual leader of the Post and supervise the observance of all religious holidays and participate in the proceedings at those functions.

He/She shall render all prayers at each meeting and any other prayers as the occasion may warrant and present.

He/She need not be a clergyman, but should be well versed in Judaism and lead an exemplary Jewish life.
