FROM MORT FRIEDLANDER

This is the third article in a series carried in the Post Bulletin to review the duties and opportunities for service in Post 64. If some of the following appears to be run on sentences that make junior high English teachers grit their teeth, I apologize and confess that I am not the original author.

THE POST COMMANDER

- 1. He shall enforce the Constitution and By-Laws of the Jewish War Veterans of the United States, and of the Post, and the Orders of the National Convention and the National and State Executive Committees, and for this purpose he may issue such orders as may be necessary.**
- 2. He shall preside at the meetings.**
- 3. He shall appoint all officers where so provided and may remove them at his discretion.**
- 4. He shall appoint such committees as may be required and vest them with powers not inconsistent with the Constitution and By-Laws.**

- 6. - 7. He shall render to the Post at the meeting at which the Annual Installation of officers takes place a complete report of his administration, showing the condition of the Post in all material aspects, this report to include a summary of the reports previously furnished to him by the Adjutant, the Quartermaster, and the Historian, and may contain such matters of interest and such recommendation as he deems may be of value to the Post.**
