Fulton Science Academy Private School envisions to be a nationally ranked and recognized school for pre-K through 12th grade, serving advanced and gifted student populations committed to academic success, civic responsibility, global citizenship, and high ethical values within a safe environment that celebrates diversity and is nurtured by the collaborative efforts of its stakeholders and the broader community.

### OUR STORY

Fulton Science Academy Private School was founded in 2012 as a nonprofit serving PreK-8. To enroll, students need to score in the top 15 percentile on nationally normed test. The FSA high school was officially formed in 2016, with the first senior class graduating in May 2019. Our high school is steadily growing. Our inaugural graduating class had 8 students and this year, our graduating class has doubled in size. High school students have 26 minutes of college preparation time every day which includes the following: SAT preparation, AP supplemental support, counselor guidance, and visits with college representatives. After school clubs, leadership opportunities, athletic and fine arts offerings are readily available to all high school students. Course placements are based on qualifications around the MAP test scores, PSAT/SAT scores, teacher recommendations, and previous overall performance.
