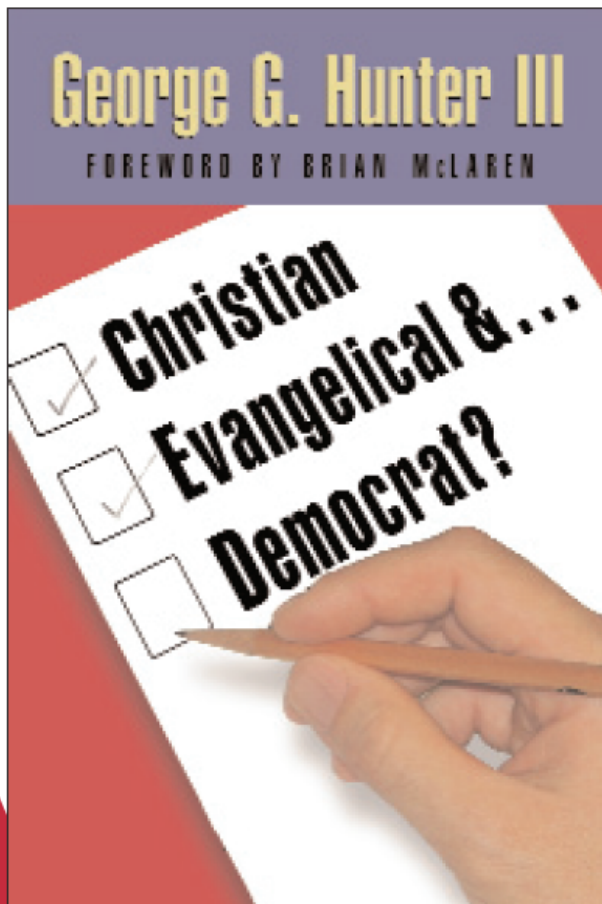

Not Just One Party

Hunter has to think hard during the months leading up to each election day. In nine presidential races, he has voted five times for the Democratic candidate, and four times for the Republican.

One Conservative Left

You might not expect bi-partisan choices from a theologically conservative evangelical ordained minister from Kentucky, who serves as a professor at Asbury Theological Seminary.

Indeed, Professor Hunter does oppose abortion and gay marriage. Yet, he does not march lock-step with the Religious Right.

The Other Issues

In this book, he examines major political issues of our day through a biblical lens. Within both major political parties, he finds policies and practices that Christians can embrace, or oppose. Hunter's book urges Christians to step back and look at the *complete* landscape of economic and social issues, which also include:

- Our stewardship of the environment
- Racial reconciliation
- Tax cuts that further enrich the wealthy
- Regulatory loopholes that benefit the corporate elite
- Spending cuts that hurt the poor
- Eagerness to wage war
- Inequities in the quality & availability of health care

Professor Hunter demonstrates how committed Christians can be found within more than one political party, serving a role of influence—as salt and light.
