

Breaking open the Word

29th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Reflection

Most of us probably learned prayer at an early age and looked forward to praying with our families at meals and at bedtime and memorizing it. As we got older, that eagerness probably waned as we got distracted with worldly things. Then older still, we turned back to prayer as more responsibilities, challenges and loved ones stretched our patience.

However, as I reflect on the lives of Saints Damien and Marianne, from an early age there are glimpses into their prayer life as they remained faithful to what they learned and to be rooted in Scriptures and to trust in God's promise of help. Continuing still to rely on divine wisdom that comes from an unwavering prayer life fed by the Eucharist, the saints continued to be persistent and to persevere even when faced with daily insurmountable obstacles.

In the Gospel we see Jesus telling the disciples that they must pray and not become weary. And so I pray that we all say yes to God's assurance of help as stated in the Psalm, that we say yes to HIS plan for our lives and that we equip ourselves for all good works by learning the Scriptures and not wavering when faced with battles, as we learn in Exodus. To be humble enough to say yes to the people God sends our way and to be persistent in our prayer life as the widow in the Gospel.

That said, may we face each day with new eyes as we pray the same rote prayers, as we attend daily or Sunday mass, as we go to confession so that we want to continue to do good works for the people in our homes, work, ministries and those we meet on the street and not grow weary as we once did as children.
