BALLOT ISSUE SHORT DESCRIPTIONS

Proposition 113 - National Popular Vote

Elect the President of the United States by national popular vote (this effectively bypasses the Electoral College)

Amendment 76 - Citizenship Qualification of Electors

To be qualified to vote at any election an individual must be a United States citizen.

Proposition 114 - Restoration of Grey Wolves

Restoration of grey wolves through their reintroduction on designated lands in Colorado

Proposition 115 - Prohibition on Late-Term Abortions

Prohibit abortion after 22 weeks gestational age of the fetus.

Proposition 116 - State Income Tax Reduction

Reduce the State Income Tax Rate from 4.63% to 4.55%

Proposition 118 - Paid Family and Medical Leave Insurance Program

Employers must provide 12-16 weeks of paid medical leave in a calendar year for covered family and medical needs

Proposition EE - Tax increase on cigarettes and tobacco products to fund Health and Education programs

Proposition 117 - Require voter approval for certain new enterprises currently exempt from TABOR. Block excessive fees.
