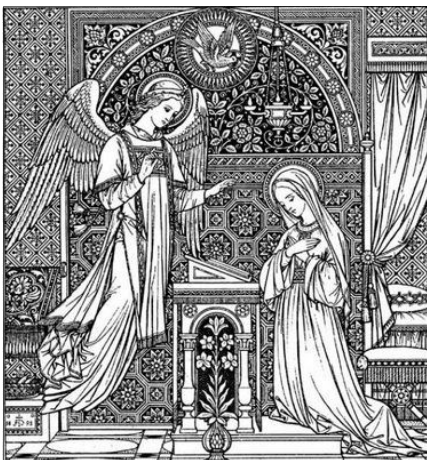

This process can be done by clicking on the “Online Giving” link on the parish website (fsspminneapolis.org) creating an account to enable automatic recurring gifts; one-time gifts are also possible through this link without creating an account. Thank you!

Flock Notes is here. This is a communication tool meant to help each parishioner quickly and simply get connected with information about the various groups and organizations at All Saints. Everyone is asked to sign up in one of two ways:

- 1.) Simply text 'COAS' to 84576. A reply will come with a link. Click on it, enter a few pieces of information, including your first and last names and your email address. It will then prompt you to click on the names of the various groups and organizations you'd like to receive notifications from and about. **All parishioners should click on 'Parish Announcements'** and then any other groups you'd like.
- 2.) To sign up by email rather than by text message simply go to churchofallsaints.flocknote.com and follow the prompts.
