### MY WINDOW NORTH & SOUTH


*My dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,*

I have been using this column to share with you the experiences of my recent trip to the outback of Alaska, the beauty of the scenery, the people, and their Faith as I saw it. Last week I wrote of my experiences of the people of the small village of Takotna. The Catholics who gathered at the Non-Denominational "Cabin", where I cele-

Although Jesus was not present in the Tabernacle, He could not be extinguished in their hearts. They were so happy and honored that I made the effort to be there to bring them the Eucharist. My visit to them was because of your generosity in helping fund my travel and the ministry of the Bishop of Fairbanks. I was so honored to be in that position and only wish that you could experience what I experienced emotionally and spiritually. But many times, we NEVER know the

### OUR LADY OF THE THIRTY THREE



On April 19, 1825, thirty-three orientals, Uruguayan patriots, landed on the beaches of the Agraciada to commence the liberation of their country. When they reached the city of Florida, Uruguay, they went to the small church and placed the future of the new nation at the feet of the Virgin. National Independence is proclaimed on August 25, and the members of the Constitutional Court having signed the Act of Independence, present themselves again before the image and place their nascent country under her protection.

Ever since, the natives have called this image La Virgen de los Treinta y Tres (The Virgin of the Thirty Three). On August 25, 1975, on the 150th anniversary of its independence, the Uruguayan nation officially declared this image of the Virgin and the church where it was venerated "Historic Monuments."

The Virgin of the Thirty Three is thirty-six centimeters high. It is a baroque carving of the Assumption of the Virgin, whose cloak and robes seem to move because of their many pleats.

Since 1857, "The Liberator of Uruguay" has a gold crown with precious stones, a gift of the second leader of the Thirty Three, who later became president of the Republic. The disproportionate size of this crown - an extraordinary gold work - has become the distinctive feature of this Marian image.

The image was crowned canonically in 1961 by a concession of His Holiness John XXIII, who the following year proclaimed her officially "Patroness of Uruguay."

The solemnity of "Our Lady of the Thirty Three" is celebrated on the second Sunday of November with a pilgrimage to her shrine from every part of the nation.

## ORDER OF THE HOLY SEPULCHRE

On the weekend of October 1-4, the annual meeting of the Western USA Lieutenancy of the Order of the Holy Sepulchre was held in Los Angeles. It was a very historic meeting as a new Lieutenant was installed by the Grand Master of the Order from Rome, Cardinal John Patrick Foley. The Governor General, Count Agostino Borromeo, the Chancellor, Rev. Msgr. Hans Brouwers, the Vice-Governor General, Jean-Marc Allard were all in attendance as well as several visiting lieutenants from other lieutenancies in the United States.

At this function, Sir Klaus Rindt was promoted to the rank of Commander with Star, Lady Rita Deiss was presented with the Gold Palm of Jerusalem. It was conferred on Lady Rita by Cardinal Foley, the Grand Master. Recipients of this honor must have served the Order with special distinction as an officer and provided extraordinary service to the Lieutenancy.

Raul and Lita DeSales and Rex and Karen McMillen of our parish, were invested as Knights and Ladies of the Order of the Holy Sepulchre. Over seven hundred members of the Order were in attendance along with twenty bishops and a large number of priests.

Since its founding 900 years ago, members of the Order of the Holy Sepulchre have dedicated themselves to personal sanctification, fidelity to the teachings of the Roman Catholic Church and support of the Christian community in the Holy Land.

Knights and Ladies of the Order of the Holy Sepulchre continue this tradition through prayer and pilgrimage, active involvement in their parish and diocese, and a commitment of financial resources to support Catholic institutions in the Holy Land.

Congratulations to the "new" knights and ladies, the promotee and honoree. San Antonio is very proud of you.

He was an elderly man living alone. A recent stroke limited his activities and he had difficulty speaking. He was about to be evicted from his home.

The skirting on his mobile home, the patio, and much of the exterior was all badly in need of repair. He was unable to do the work himself and he didn't have the money to hire anyone. Repairs were needed to avoid eviction.

Within days of being asked eight men went to work. About \$1000 of materials was purchased. Three weekends later all of the required repairs were completed and the eviction notice was withdrawn.

These men are members of the Knights of Columbus from San Antonio Parish.

***The number of active members at San Antonio is 215.***

This year the Knights will spend up to \$30,000 in direct support of abused, homeless and hungry men, women and children in Orange County.

Father Michael McGivney, a simple parish priest, founded the Knights of Columbus in New Haven Connecticut in 1882.

results of the contribution we make with just a smile, a thought, a prayer, our momentary listening to someone or yes, a financial contribution to a charity. I want you to know what a difference you made in the lives of these very few people in this most remote part of our United States. I then told of my meeting blind Anna and hearing her confession and how happy I was that she could not "see" what a basket case I was listening to her sins. I then went to bless the most

modest cabin where she lives by herself. The door was unhinged and the screen falling off; I could see the disarray of the interior, but this was her home. My thoughts led me to the most humble dwelling of the stable where Jesus was born. Christmas will bring these images to my mind this year. We seem to tell ourselves we need way too much in our lives. This elderly woman, in the remote part of Alaska, had very little by our standards but had all she needed and was a most wealthy person in our Faith.

These three weekends (last week and the next two) we will be looking at a "Stewardship" way of Life. We have all been given by God gifts of Time, Talent, and Treasure. We may think these are 'our' possessions, that we struggle for them and own them.

But God has allowed us to be here, given us abilities and opportunities to pursue those abilities not just for ourselves, but to make a difference in the lives of others. By your prayers and support of my time and talent, you made a difference in the lives of these people so far away that we would never have known there was a poor Athabascan woman living in the small gathering of cabins along the Takotna River in Alaska. We helped her to receive the sacraments she had been deprived of for three years, those very same sacraments, the real presence of our Lord that we can receive every day here. In these three weeks, I am asking you just to reflect on the difference you can make even in the life of one person here by the investment you can make of your

Time, your Talent or Treasure. We have so much to offer here to the many people of our parish and community. By your contribution of Time: your prayers, your smile, and your kind words to someone, you can make a difference to someone. By investing your Talent: volunteering in one of our many organizations, in Youth, Young Adult or Adult Ministry, you can make a difference. By a contribution of your Treasure: you can be as-

sured that you are promoting all our Ministries, not only to just maintain them, but to EXPAND our outreach to all future people who come to us, that we as a parish, may BE the Body of Christ as Jesus wants us to be. I ask you just to think about the important connection we made to the few I visited this summer with the little we invested, and compare that to the great opportunity and potential we have to make a difference in the lives of our many young and older people right here in our own parish. May you be as graced by God and others as I have felt in my life as a priest by whatever you can do for our Lord with your Time, Talents and Treasure.
