



NH BASS Nation & Upper Valley Weekend Warriors



Morning Information

- **There will be NO morning registration.** Send-off order will be pre-determined via Face Book Live the night before. Raffle Prizes will be drawn on Face Book Live after send-off order is called. You may verify your boat number with state team staff at ramp. Prizes will be given out at the ramp in the morning.
- Follow directions of staff for launching and parking at WAM. Same-team partners should handle your own equipment for launching and parking. Please follow social distancing and face covering guidelines. You may launch elsewhere but you are still responsible for the facility fee of \$30.
- Please respect residents at WAM - Keep noise level to minimum and DO NOT block traffic at ANY TIME. Trolling motor ONLY until you have passed the last dock into the channel.
- Take off will be in front of WAM beyond the channel marker. Please stage off shore from the sand bar, NO fishing, graphing, scouting, equipment testing is allowed prior to send off.
- Send off starts at 7AM and check in at 3PM with only one flight.
- Proceed single file in send-off order. Pass the send-off boat with your Live Wells open and running, PFD zipped and buckled, kill switch attached. You will be asked to pull the kill switch. Make sure you are 150 feet beyond send-off boat before getting on plane.

Tournament Information

- PFD's must be on and buckled any time the combustion engine is on.
- If your boat is in gear, both anglers must be seated with both feet on the floor. NO fishing while idling through no-wake areas.
- Speed limit is 45MPH, obey 150 foot rule and no-wake zones. All NH boating laws apply. If you get a citation for any reason, your catch will be disqualified. Marine Patrol will be out monitoring.
- In the event of equipment failure, you must contact a tournament official first for your options.
- You may not leave your boat except in emergency. Contact the Tournament Director or Nation President (see below) for any emergencies, rule violations or questions during the tournament.
- 8 fish limit, 12" minimum, lunker must be alive, no culling of dead fish, artificial lures only. Refer to all NHF&G and BASS rules. Our rules can be found at nhbassnation.com

Afternoon Information

- Must check-in at 3PM, off plane, at no wake buoy in front of WAM channel/sand bar. **Check-in boat anglers will be wearing Hi-Vis Vests.** Late penalty – 1lb per min.
- Weigh-in by boat number only. Please stage in front of the sand bar until you are instructed to come in for weigh-in.
- There will be limited parking at the weigh-in docks. 5 boats at a time from a designated dock. No holding tanks will be available so do not come up with your fish until called.
- You will be using your own weigh-in bag, please tag lunkers, fish bagged prior to docking.
- Only ONE person is allowed to bring your fish up for weigh-in. Face covering is required during this process. Please dump all your fish into the bumping tank and collect your water back into your bag, leave your bag in the basket and step back.

- After your fish are weighed, you must leave the docking area immediately, head back out to release your fish and proceed to take out. Please do not linger because there will NOT be any post tournament award ceremony.
- You may NOT pull your boat out of water at any time prior to weighing your fish.
- All fish must be released 300ft off shore in deep water.
- NO POWER LOADING at launch ramp. Please remember to clean, drain and dry. **We must cooperate with WAM to ensure the future usage of their facilities. They are discounting our facility fee by \$10 per boat!**
- Results will be posted immediately after the tournament. Our goal is to do this immediately after the last person weighs in as long as we have good cell phone service.
- Checks will be issued and mailed to each individual (make sure your address is complete and accurate on registration form).
- NH Bass Nation will follow all CDC and NH State Covid-19 guidelines for our tournaments. We will have masks, gloves, hand sanitizer available and we will be sanitizing all our equipment during and after the tournament. Please remember to stay 6 feet apart and cover your face and be safe.

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
