Students must have either TOEFL iBT® 61, TOEIC® 650, IELTS 5.5 overall (with writing 5.5), completed SSLC ESL-SF Level 4 or ESL-SC Level 8, any recognized international English language equivalency test score, or a pass on our Entrance Exam. Interview and essay required.

EXIT REQUIREMENTS

Program exit level is SSLC Exit Test score of 65% and an overall average of 80% in course work. If a student fails to meet these requirements, they can retake the next available module.
