NO SCHOOL - NEXT MONDAY

There is no school on Monday, October 12, for teachers in -service.

CALENDAR CHANGE

On the yearly school calendar, we had scheduled a half-day on November 4 to give teachers travel time for their Teacher's Conference in Phoenix. This conference has been canceled so that we will have a full day of school on November 4. There will still be no school on November 5 and 6. The teachers will be having in-service or participating in a local teacher's conference instead.

STUDENTS THAT ARE SICK

Just a reminder that if a student is not feeling well that they should stay home. We have a decision tree on our website to give guidance to parents when students are sick. San Diego County has released new guidance about what to do with siblings when students are sick. We will work through those and make any necessary adjustments to the school's decision tree. If they are showing COVID symptoms, they have three options for returning to school:

1. Get tested for COVID - If it is a negative test, symptoms have subsided, and they are fever-free for 24 hours without medication, they can return to school.
2. Get a doctor's note – The doctor's note will need to state that reason for the symptoms and when the student can return to school.
3. Do Nothing – The student will need to stay home for 10 days from when the symptoms started and can return when the symptoms have subsided, and they are fever-free for 24 hours without medication.

Also, with flu season around the corner, parents may want to think about getting flu shots for the students. This is not a requirement, but encouragement to consider.
