

SNHSA COVID-19 Procedures for the 2021 show season

To ensure the safety of all involved in horse show competition and to follow the Governor's directives, the SNHSA Board has determined the following rules for the 2021 show season.

- SNHSA follows all state/county COVID-19 guidelines.
- You may not enter the grounds if:
 - You have a fever of or above 99.5 (Please take your temperature at home the morning of the show to confirm that you do not have a fever.)
 - Have any COVID-19 symptoms (subjective or measured fever, cough, and shortness of breath and/or difficulty breathing. Additional symptoms may include sore throat, muscle pain, headache, chills/shaking, or newly developed loss of taste or smell)
 - Have tested positive for COVID-19 within the last 2 weeks, and have not had 2 negative tests since the positive test
 - Have been exposed to anyone who has tested positive for COVID-19 within the last 2 weeks
- Maintain 6' of social distance from all non-household members when possible.
- Show managers may have additional policies and procedures for their venue, and these will be included on the individual show barn's prize lists.
