- Supports home-schooling, private or parochial schools, vouchers, and tuition tax credits, etc.
- Encourages teaching the Bible as an elective in public schools.

DEMOCRAT

- Silent on school choice.
- "We believe a strong public education system is an anchor of our democracy" for "all children!"

SEX EDUCATION

REPUBLICAN

- Supports “sexual risk avoidance education that sets
- abstinence until marriage as the responsible and respected standard of behavior!”

DEMOCRAT

- Promotes condom-based sex education.

TRANSGENDER BATHROOMS IN SCHOOLS

REPUBLICAN

- Opposes the Obama administration’s Title IX transgender bathroom edict, since it is “at once illegal, dangerous, and ignores privacy issues,” and “impose[s] a social and cultural revolution upon the American people by wrongly redefining sex discrimination to include sexual orientation or other categories!”

DEMOCRAT

- Supports the Obama administration’s redefinition of “sex discrimination” in Title IX to mandate transgender bathrooms and showers in public schools and universities through “the continued development of sex discrimination law to cover LGBT people!”

SOCIAL EXPERIMENTS IN THE MILITARY

- Opposes the federal government funding abortion overseas and calls for restoring the Mexico City Policy, to bar federal money from going to foreign organizations which “provide or promote abortion,” or are complicit in China’s one-child policy.
- Condemns the Obama administration for “impos[ing] on foreign recipients, especially the peoples of Africa, its own radical social agenda while excluding faith-based groups!”

DEMOCRAT

- Calls for funding abortion on demand overseas by repealing the Helms Amendment, which bars U.S. foreign money for abortion.
- Will “ensure America’s foreign policy is inclusive of LGBT people around the world ... including combating efforts by any nation to infringe on LGBT rights or ignore abuse

ON TERRORISM

REPUBLICAN

- “Radical Islamic terrorism poses an existential threat to personal freedom and peace around the world. We oppose its brutal assault on all human beings, all of whom have inherent dignity!”

DEMOCRAT

- Believes in “defeating terrorism and combatting climate change!”

SANCTITY OF HUMAN LIFE

REPUBLICAN

- “Proud to be the party that protects human life and offers real solutions for women” and “strongly oppose[s] infanticide.” Supports the following: the Born-Alive Abortion Survivors Protection Act; a human life constitutional amendment; a ban on abortion at 20 weeks, when unborn babies can feel pain; a ban on abortion based on sex or disability; a ban on dismemberment abortion “in which unborn babies are literally torn apart limb from limb”; abortion clinic safety regulations; a ban on human cloning, and on creating and experimenting upon human embryos, including three-parent embryos; a ban on any sale of fetal body parts; and a ban on the “use of public funds to perform or promote abortion or to fund organizations, like Planned Parenthood:’

DEMOCRAT

- Calls for government funded abortion on demand through all nine months of pregnancy, by “repealing the Hyde Amendment”, which bars federal money for elective abortion.
- Will “overturn—federal and state laws and policies that impede a woman’s access to abortion!’
- “We will continue to stand up to Republican efforts to defund Planned Parenthood!’

REDEFINING MARRIAGE

REPUBLICAN

- “The American family... is the foundation of civil society, and the cornerstone of the family is natural marriage, the union of one man and one woman.”
- “We condemn the Supreme Court’s ruling in ...Obergefell v. Hodges”and “we urge its reversal, whether through judicial reconsideration or a constitutional amendment returning control over marriage to the states:’

DEMOCRAT

- Supports the redefinition of marriage through the Court’s judicial activism in Obergeferthat recognized LGBT people ... have the right to marry the person they love:’

RELIGIOUS LIBERTY VS. LGBT AGENDA

REPUBLICAN

- “Strongly support[s] the freedom of Americans to act in accordance with their religious beliefs, not only in their houses of worship, but also in their everyday lives:’

Legislative UPDATE

Our local Florida State Representative, Majority Leader Dane Eagle, was recognized by the National Republican Congressional Committee and Leader Kevin McCarthy on their list of Contenders in the Young Guns program, despite being one of eight Republicans running to succeed Rep. Francis Rooney. Contender candidates, the second level of the Young Guns program, have completed stringent program metrics and are on the path to developing a mature and competitive campaign operation, according to the NRCC website.

The Florida Senate and House both passed their budgets with unanimous votes. The Senate budget (SB 2500) totals \$91.370 billion. The nearly

\$1.5 billion difference will be addressed in conference negotiations.

SB 1878 Funding for Water Restoration and Protection - was approved by the Environment and Natural Resources Committee. This bill secures \$625 million annually over the next three years, as recommended by Governor DeSantis. This funding is vital for the protection of the Everglades and Florida's valuable water resources. Both House and Senate budgets include more than \$625 million for water resources next year.

SB 362 - VISIT FLORIDA - Passed in Senate 36-0 to postpone the scheduled July 1, 2020 repeal of this important tourism marketing tool for eight years, through October 1, 2028. In House messages now.

HB 389 Point-of-Care Testing and Treatment – would permit pharmacists to diagnose and treat influenza and strep at community pharmacies, using point-of-care tests that have the U.S. Food and Drug Administration approval. A supervising physician would be required to review the actions taken by a pharmacist. Approved by the Health Care Appropriations Subcommittee.

HB 833 Program of All-Inclusive Care for the Elderly (PACE) - PACE provides comprehensive medical and social services to seniors while allowing them to remain in their own homes. It was approved by the Appropriations Subcommittee on Health and Human Services on 2/18. HB 833 codifies PACE in law, creates a provider application process and could lead to increased access, improve patient outcomes and produce considerable cost-savings to the taxpayer.

HB 37 - School Bus Safety passed 118-0 -Revising civil penalties for certain violations relating to stopping for a school bus; providing an effective date of July 1, 2020.

HB 7011- Wellbeing of students participating in Extracurricular Activities passed 117-0. Each public school that is a member of the Florida High School Athletic Association (FHSAA) must have an operational automated external defibrillator on the school grounds. The defibrillator must be available in a clearly marked and publicized location for each athletic contest, practice, workout, or conditioning session, including those conducted outside of the school year. Establish requirements for cooling zones, including, at a minimum, the immediate availability of cold-water immersion tubs or equivalent materials to rapidly cool internal body temperature when a student exhibits symptoms of exertional heat stroke and the presence of an employee or volunteer trained to implement cold-water immersion. Require each school's emergency action plan, as required by the FHSAA, to include a procedure for onsite cooling using cold-water immersion or its equivalent before a student is transported to a hospital for exertional heat stroke. The requirements of this paragraph apply during and outside of the school year.

HB 581 -Civics Instruction - passed its final committee, Education, and now goes to the floor. It authorizes the development and integration of a nonpartisan civic literacy practicum in public schools. The bill requires the Commissioner of Education to develop minimum criteria for a nonpartisan civic literacy practicum that may be incorporated into a school's curriculum for the high school United States Government course beginning in the 2021-22 school year.

SB 1088- Teacher Pay Increase Proposal - creates a new teacher salary enhancement categorical in the Florida Education Finance Program (FEFP), the \$22 billion funding that allocates most of the funding for public schools. Details on funding in the bill would be spelled out each year in the budget. Any money provided for salary enhancements would roll into the base student allocation the following year. The Senate Education Committee passed the bill unanimously.

In the House, the PreK-12 Appropriations Subcommittee developed a preliminary proposal for teacher pay of \$462.6 million. This would be done by cutting other education funding and adding those dollars to the base student allocation with the intent of increasing teacher pay. Part of funding would come from cutting the "Best and Brightest" teacher bonus program.

HB 157 - A Resolution to be placed on the ballot: LIMITATION ON TERMS OF OFFICE FOR MEMBERS OF A DISTRICT SCHOOL BOARD Passed 2/20. This Proposes an amendment to the State Constitution to limit terms for School Board Members by prohibiting incumbent members who have held the office for the preceding eight years from appearing on a ballot for reelection to that office and to specify that the amendment only applies to terms of office beginning on or after November 3, 2020.

Speaking of School Boards, the Lee County School Board continues discussion to vote on adding a *(Continued on next page)*

(Continued from previous page) referendum on our 2020 Ballot to increase their millage rate on our homes, which would also increase the taxes paid by our School Teachers. The School District states that they need more of our tax dollars to increase teacher pay. Despite the School District's increased revenue from the half-penny sales tax referendum, passed in 2018, the teachers have not received any substantial salary increase. The Lee County School District only has three registered Republicans on the Board. Two registered Republican School Board Members campaigned strongly to pass the half-penny sales tax - and it succeeded. One registered Republican School Board Member, Melisa Giovanelli, campaigned against it. They are all three running for re-election this year. If you would like to contact the Lee County School Board Members to question them about our increasing taxes, again, please call or email them.
