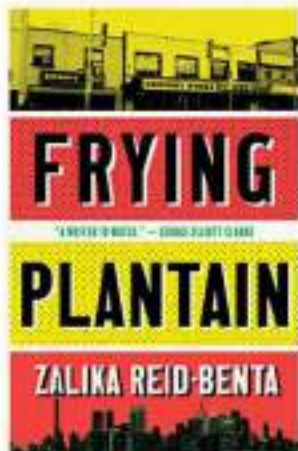

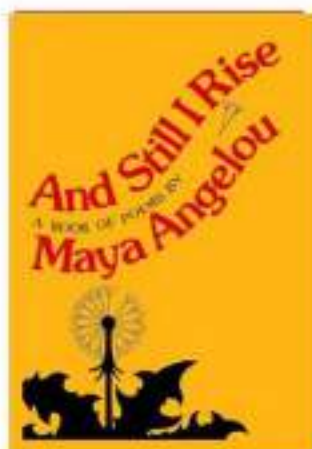


Frying Plantain

Soothing, Uplifting and Essential poems by our Nobel ancestor Dr. Maya Angelou, a good start for every morning.

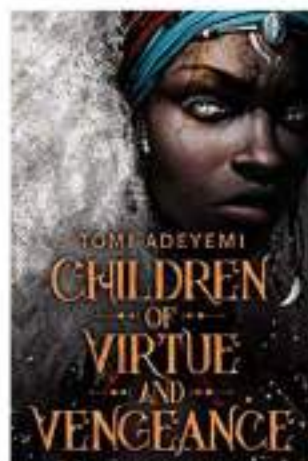


Children of Blood and Bone

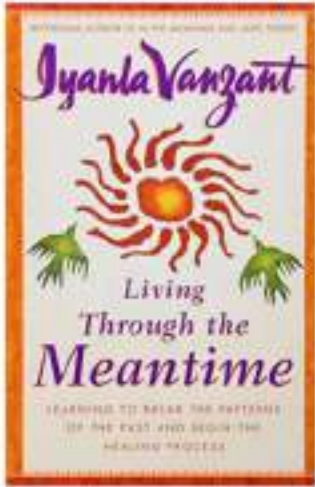

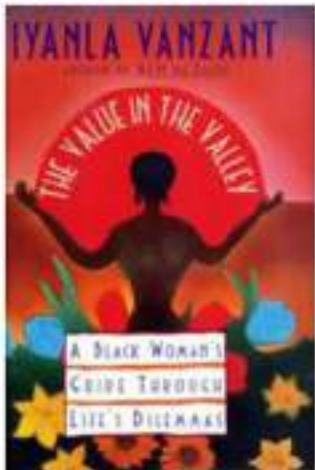


Living Through the Meantime
