Lexington Community Farm, also known as **LexFarm**, is a nonprofit working farm in Lexington, MA. LexFarm works to connect the community to locally grown food and sustainable farming practices while preserving historic farmland.

As part of their community outreach, LexFarm offers adult education workshops, such as the Evening Organic Gardening Series, and Flower Crown Workshops. Children also have a place at LexFarm, through the nonprofit's afterschool and summer programs, where they spend time learning about the farm, working doing "farm chores" in the Learning Garden, playing games and doing projects. Fun events like Sunset Yoga, Summer Concerts, and Family Picnics round out the robust event schedule.

Progressive Grower supplies LexFarm with growing supplies large and small, from drip-tape to tomato twine. Since adding a low-phosphorus fertility scheme to the LexFarm practices, items such as medium release nitrogen [Peanut Meal](#) and Soybean Meal have become go-to fertilizer solutions for the farm.
