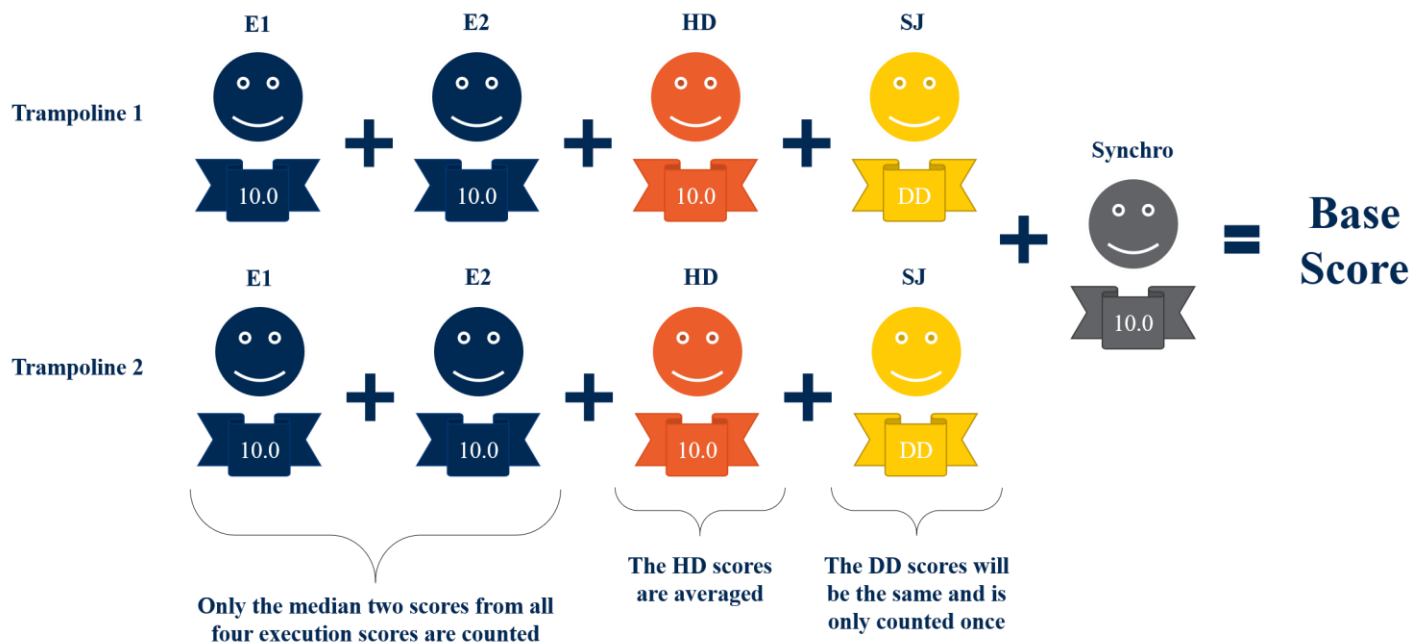


Synchronized Trampoline Scoring

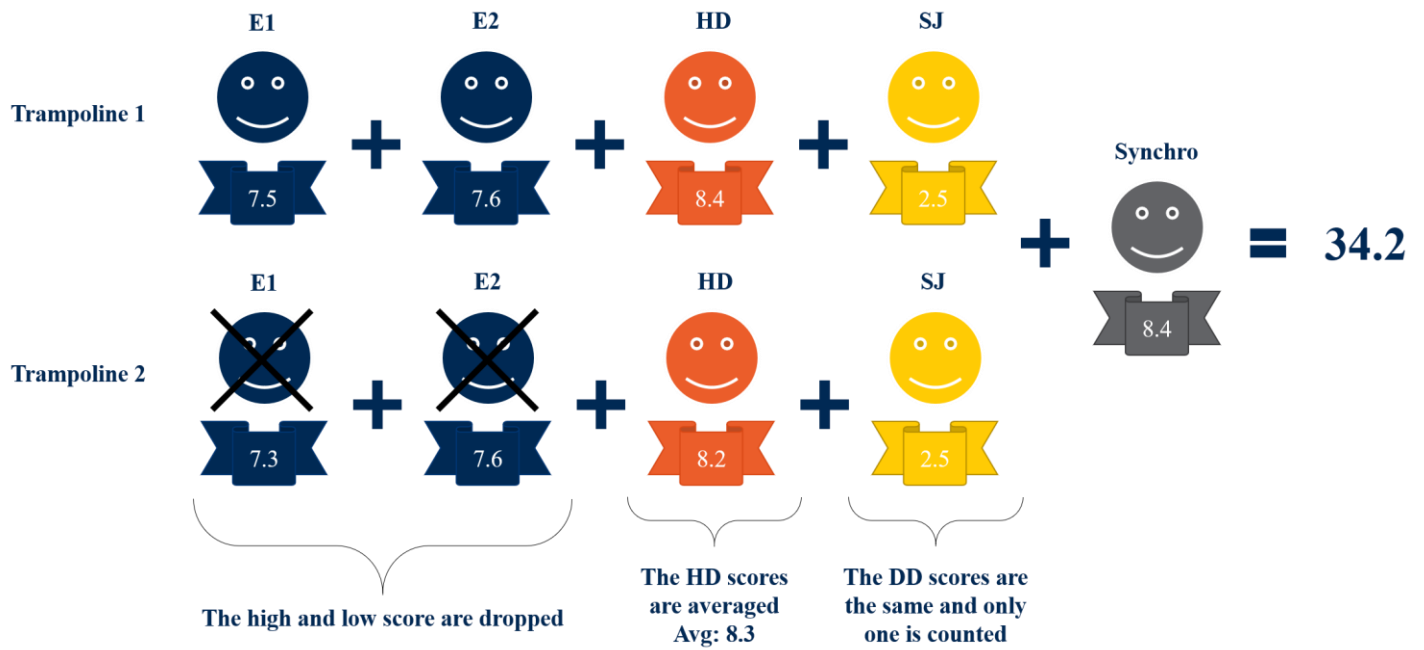
Each athlete pair performs one voluntary routine. The routine is assessed by nine judges. Each trampoline has two execution judges and a horizontal displacement judge that each provide a score out of 10.0. Each trampoline also has one superior/difficulty judge provides a difficulty score based on the skills performed. There is an additional synchronicity judge that judges the level of synchronicity between the paired athletes. When there are a total of four execution judges, the median two scores will be counted, no matter which trampoline they are from.

(Note: This assumes that there is a full panel of judges. Score calculation for smaller panels can be found in Section II.c. of the NAIGC Synchronized Trampoline Code of Points)



Score Calculation

- Only the 2 median execution scores are added together for the final score, the high and low scores will be dropped. These scores may be from the same trampoline, or from different trampolines. Each score will be out of 10.0 for a maximum score of 20.0.
- The horizontal displacement scored from each trampoline will be averaged together to create one score out of 10.0.
- The difficulty score will be calculated separately for each trampoline. The final difficulty scores should be the same, otherwise an interruption will occur. The difficulty score will only be added once to the final score.
- The synchronicity score is based out of a 10.0 and is a judgement of the synchronicity of the athletes.



All other rules remain the same as Individual Trampoline
