These helpful guidelines are provided for our members so that everyone will be able to get the most out of their Zoom viewing.

*Log-on to Zoom at least 5 minutes prior to any teaching or sermon.

*Have your Bible, pen/pencil and paper handy to keep notes.

*When sharing your screen be advised that your image, your location and your surroundings will be viewed and recorded through all of Greater Sweethome social media outlets .Keep in mind what type of image you want to present to the world.

*When coming on to Zoom please put your device on mute.

*On Tuesday nights Bible Study the instructor wants to see you to engage in a dialog. Be in a lighted area were your face can be seen clearly. We encourage all members to ask questions and interact with the instructor. Tuesdays are designed as a class structure, it's Bible study not a sermon. Reading over the lesson ahead of time and sharing your comments and asking questions is wanted. When asking a question or making a comment take your device off of mute and there is a raise hand button on the bottom of your screen as well to get the instructor's attention.

*Try to locate yourself in a quiet place with good lighting. Turn off the tv's, radios, or anything that may be distracting to you and others.

*Come on Zoom as if you were joining a Holy Ghost party. Not only the host can see you on Zoom but anyone that are friends with Greater Sweethome on our Facebook page, anybody that log onto our YouTube channel or click onto our website. You'll be recorded on all of our social media outlets during the same time as Bible Study and Wednesday Mid-Week Worship is streaming 7pm. Thank you in advance for your cooperation.
