Determination that Zuckerman Family Farms is a Critical Infrastructure Company

The Board of Directors of Zuckerman Family Farms, after consulting with its legal counsel, has reviewed the Executive Order N-33-20 issued by Governor Newsom on March 19, 2020 commonly reported as the 'Stay-at-Home' order. The Executive Order states that it does not apply to the critical infrastructure sectors as outlined by the Department of Homeland Security.

After reviewing the website <https://www.cisa.gov/identifying-critical-infrastructure-during-covid-19>, the Board of Directors has determined that this company meets the definition of a critical infrastructure company for the following reasons:

- A. With respect to the growing, harvesting, selling, packing, and transporting of agricultural food products, this Company is exempt from the Order because it is a Food & Agricultural specific supply company as defined by the Department of Homeland Security.
- B. With respect to the growing, harvesting, transporting and selling of sod products, this Company is exempt from the Order pursuant to the definitions issued by California at <https://covid19.ca.gov/stay-home-except-for-essential-needs/> that specifically states that construction, and specifically housing construction, is a critical infrastructure activity.

These exemptions permit the Company to continue to operate, distribute and sell its products under the terms of the Order.
