

Road closures in Lennoxville start today

Lennoxville drivers will be in for some interesting detours this week depending on where they are travelling to and from, thanks to two significant construction projects in the borough.

First, today marks the start of the long awaited work to repair the surface of the Bishop's Bridge. Beginning today and continuing for the next two weeks, only one lane of the bridge will be open with traffic alternating directions.

With congestion in downtown Lennoxville already an issue at peak hours, it is safe to say that those who can should consider a route that avoids the span and the College/Queen intersection entirely. It is important to note that after that two week period with one lane open, the bridge will be completely closed to all but pedestrian traffic for at least six weeks for the work to be finished. That six week period will include the Bishop's University Convocation, Friendship Day, and the end of the regular school year at Alexander Galt Regional High School.

The bad traffic news continues for those living on the eastern bank of the Saint-Francis River as the street of the same name will be closed at its intersection with Atto Street for repairs to the water network from Monday through Thursday. Drivers will be detoured up Champigny and along Moulton Hill.
