



America's Boating Club of the North Olympic Peninsula 2020 Cruise Schedule

As of March 27, 2020

Many closures have occurred since Governor Inslee's "Stay Home, Stay Healthy" Order became effective on March 25 to counter the spread of Covid-19, the Coronavirus by staying home. That Order is in effect until April 8, 2020, and it may be extended if he determines it necessary.

*Washington State Parks has closed overnight stays in campgrounds and cabins through April 30, and we are waiting to see if that closure will be extended to moorage and use of mooring buoys in State Parks.

*San Juan County's Health Officer, Dr. Frank James, issued Order 2020-1 on March 25, which effectively closes all Port and Marina facilities in San Juan County to non-essential visitors until midnight April 30, unless extended.

*The Canadian/U.S. border was closed March 21 to non-essential travel for at least 30 days. The closure may be extended for an indefinite period.

In response to the closures announced to date, we are modifying the 2020 Cruise Schedule.

August Desolation Sound Cruise: (Dependent upon US/Canadian Border being re-opened to non-essential travel. Closed March 21 to April 20, may be extended.)

September Broughton Islands, British Columbia, Canada: (Dependent upon US/Canadian Border being re-opened to non-essential travel. Closed March 21 to April 20, may be extended.)
