Why become a Certified Nursing Assistant (CNA)?

Certified Nursing Assistants are a critical part of the health care team. CNAs are often the primary caregivers of patients and assist with daily activities such as bathing, dressing, and eating as well as measuring vital signs such as blood pressure and temperature.



There is a high demand for CNAs, and job growth is expected to increase by 11% by 2026. The median income for a CNA in 2016 was \$12.78 per hour.

Students in the Healthcare Pathway will complete five credit hours of post-secondary coursework (HLHS 107) in preparation for the Certified Nursing Assistance licensure examination. The program is 16 weeks and students will complete 48 classroom hours, 32 lab hours, and 48 clinical hours.
