

BFR Guidelines During the COVID-19 Bridge Phase

In response to continued health risks created by gatherings of multiple people, we are continuing precautions to lessen the potential transmission of COVID-19 to our participants and staff.

When you arrive at BFR

1. If you feel sick or have been in contact with someone displaying symptoms, stay at home. If you should become sick during an event, see our medical staff and/or leave the facility immediately.
2. Wear a face covering when presenting your documents in Registration and maintain social distancing whenever possible remaining 6 feet from other individuals. Everyone must go through the registration process to gain access to the track.
3. Track waivers must be signed and witnessed at the track.
4. Participants must bring their own hand sanitizer. Everyone should practice frequent hand washing.
5. Participants are required to provide their own personal gear. Sharing personal equipment is prohibited.

Paddock and Grid Areas

1. The Illinois Department of Public Health mandates the use of a face covering for everyone over the age of 2 who can medically tolerate one while indoors. A facial covering should be worn in the restrooms, Medical Building, Timing and Scoring Building, and Pit Stop while social distancing maintaining 6 feet from other individuals.
2. Concessions will be available. Food will be available at the window while maintaining social distancing.
3. Seating in the Pavilion area will be available for dining with tables arranged to allow for 6 feet between. Groups sitting together are limited to parties of up to 10 people. When the Pavilion is unavailable because it is in use as a classroom, participants will need to use the outdoor seating near the Pavilion or in the Hawk's Nest or return to their paddock areas.
4. Communication with drivers/racers/riders will be done via the PA system and/or FM radio.
5. Drivers/racers/riders should paddock 10 feet from each other and maintain 6 feet social distancing when outside their personal paddock space.
6. Camping will be available. Campsites should be spaced 10 feet apart.
7. BFR has revised capacity limits for classroom sessions to accommodate social distancing.
8. BFR is offering organizers and sanctioning bodies the option to develop plans and procedures specific to their individual events to operate safely according to the CDC, the State of Illinois Department of Public Health, and the Winnebago County Department of Public Health.

BFR is partnering with organizers and sanctioning bodies to ensure compliance with these guidelines. Failure to follow the BFR guidelines may result in your removal from the facility.

These guidelines will be reviewed according to changing conditions.
