


March 2021 Overdose Report

ODMAP Data: In the month of March 2021, there were 128 suspected overdoses reported to ODMAP between the City of New Haven (110), and the Quinnipiack Valley Health District (18) towns of Hamden, North Haven, Bethany and Woodbridge. Of these suspected overdoses, two were reported to ODMAP as being fatal. There were 40 total naloxone administrations in the month of January: 19 non-fatal multiple doses of naloxone, 19 non-fatal single dose naloxone, 2 fatal multiple doses naloxone and 86 non-fatal overdoses with naloxone administration unknown. Monday, March 29th had the most suspected overdoses reported for the month with 8 suspected overdoses compared to a daily average of 4 overdoses (up from 2.9 in February). The most common day of the week for reported overdoses in March was on Tuesdays with 23 suspected overdoses reported compared to an average of 18 overdoses per day (up from 12 in February). Additionally, the most common timeframe of reported overdoses was between 12:00 am and 3:00 am (33).



Total Suspected Overdoses in February 2021 (NHHD & QVHD)

Suspected Overdoses by Time of Day in February 2021 (NHHD & QVHD)




ODMAP Heat Map for NHHD and QVHD jurisdictions




EpiCenter Data: The graphs to the right from EpiCenter include data from local emergency departments (ED) related to admissions involving suspected drug overdoses. It should be noted that only data for residents of New Haven and Quinnipiack Valley who were transported to an ED after an overdose are collected. According to this data, overdoses in February were most prevalent among White (60) residents and those between the ages of 30-39 (31) years of age. Additionally, opioid-specific suspected overdoses continue to increase steadily in New Haven and the Quinnipiack Valley compared to previous years.



Suspected Drug Overdose ED Visits in February 2021 by Age


Suspected Drug Overdose ED Visits in February 2021 by Race

National Prescription Drug Takeback Day
